EARLY IMPLEMENTATION

Medi-Cal is undergoing a transformation called CalAIM to provide members with more equitable, comprehensive, and personcentered care. Enhanced Care Management (ECM) and Community Supports are two major CalAIM programs that launched in 2022.

ENHANCED CARE MANAGEMENT

ECM is a comprehensive care management benefit to address clinical and non-clinical needs for the <u>highest-need members</u> enrolled in Medi-Cal managed care plans (MCPs).

LAUNCH OF ELIGIBLE POPULATIONS

Select "Populations of Focus" go live <u>across 2022 through 2024</u>, as a phased implementation of ECM.



Members Enrolled in ECM






COMMUNITY SUPPORTS






MEMBERS SERVED BY COMMUNITY SUPPORTS


21,595 members received at least one Community Support in the first half of 2022.

This number is expected to grow as more providers contract with MCPs to deliver services, providers develop their capacity, and members and their families learn about and connect to these services.

The number of transitioned members receiving services declined by the end of the second quarter when many stabilized and no longer needed services.
