- **SUBJECT:** Threshold Languages Data
- **REFERENCE:** California Code of Regulations, Title 9, section 1810.410 DMH Information Notice No. <u>10-02</u> and <u>10-17</u> <u>2017-2022 MHP Contract</u>
- **PURPOSE:** To explain how Mental Health Plans (MHPs) may obtain threshold language data to meet state and federal linguistic requirements and complete cultural competence plans (CCPs)

BACKGROUND:

MHPs are required to comply with all cultural competence and linguistic requirements in state and federal law, including those in CCR, Title 9, section 1810.410; the contract between the MHP and the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS)¹; and DMH Information Notice No. <u>10-02</u> and <u>10-17</u>. As part of these requirements, MHPs must

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develop and implement CCPs.² On an annual basis, DHCS reviews and approves CCP updates submitted by the MHPs.³ DHCS also provides MHPs with access to threshold language data that allow MHPs to meet their legal and contractual obligations, and ensures all beneficiaries have access to culturally and linguistically competent specialty mental health services.

POLICY:

DHCS provides periodic threshold language updates to MHPs to ensure linguistic competence in the public mental health system. Per CCR, Title 9, section 1810.410, subdivision (a)(3), "Threshold Language" means a "language identified as the primary language, as indicated on the Medi-Cal Eligibility Data System, of 3,000 beneficiaries or five percent of the beneficiary population, whichever is lower, in an identified geographic area."

MHPs can obtain current threshold language data using the California Health and Human Services' <u>Open Data Portal</u>. The data are released quarterly (in January, April, July, and October).
