SUBJECT: THRESHOLD LANGUAGES

The Department of Health Care Services provides annual Threshold Language updates to counties to ensure linguistic competence in the public mental health system. Counties are required to comply with all Threshold Language requirements contained in Title 9, California Code of Regulations (CCR), Section 1810.410 and Cultural Competence Plan Requirements (CCPR) contained in Information Notice No. 10-02 and 10-17 accordingly. This Information Notice contains updated Threshold Language data.

“Threshold Language” means a language identified as the primary language, as indicated on the Medi-Cal Eligibility Data System (MEDS), of 3,000 beneficiaries or five percent of the beneficiary population, whichever is lower, in an identified geographic area, per Title 9, CCR Section 1810.410 (a)(3).

Enclosed are the following:

Enclosure 1- Medi-Cal Eligibles by Primary Language (October 2011): This enclosure displays the distribution by language of Medi-Cal eligibles in each county. Primary language of the beneficiary is self-reported. Highlighted cells represent those languages designated as Threshold Languages in accordance with Title 9, CCR, section 1810.410 (a)(3).

Enclosure 2- Threshold Languages By County: This enclosure lists the threshold languages per county.
