
The Local Homelessness Plan (LHP) Template is a required application component for CalAIM Managed Care Plans (MCPs) seeking funding under the Housing and Homelessness Incentive Program (HHIP).

MCPs must collaborate with their local Continuums of Care (CoCs) and, if applicable, other MCPs operating in that region to complete one LHP Template per county. For counties where multiple MCPs operate, the MCPs should select one organization to compile responses and submit a single LHP.

The LHP is due by June 30, 2022.



Part I of the LHP Template is based on <u>individual MCP responses</u>; Parts II and III include <u>both</u> aggregate county-wide and MCP-specific responses; and Part IV is an <u>aggregate county-wide response</u>.



### Part I: Measurement Across Three Program Priority Areas

This section outlines the required measurement areas for HHIP.

- MCPs must provide quantitative and narrative responses to these measures, which are intended to provide DHCS with information on current regional progress on and upcoming goals for each of the three HHIP priority areas:
  - Partnerships and capacity to support referrals for services;
  - Infrastructure to coordinate and meet member housing needs; and
  - **Delivery** of services and member engagement.
- <u>Each MCP</u> participating in HHIP must complete the HHIP Measures via the MCP LHP submission. See MCP LHP Excel template provided by DHCS.

#### Part III: Landscape Analysis of Member Demographics, Needs, and Gaps

This section establishes a format for MCPs to provide the following required information: A local landscape analysis of MCP members and Identification of the number of individuals and families served.

- Local landscape analysis of MCP members (*Table 1*). This landscape analysis is intended to align with the *Homeless Housing, Assistance and Prevention Program Round 3 (HHAP-3)* application landscape analysis, which utilizes data from the Homeless Data Integration System (HDIS), point-in-time (PIT) counts, and other local needs assessments.
- Identification of the number of individuals and families served (*Table 2*). This response should include information on the demographics of those served, types of intervention services provided, and demographics of subpopulations that are underserved, relative to the proportion of individuals in that subpopulation experiencing homelessness.
