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PURPOSE

The purpose of this bulletin is to identify how counties and providers should bill Drug Medi-Cal (DMC) for the purpose of tracking Substance Abuse and Crime Prevention (SACPA) clients. **DISCUSSION**

Drug Medi-Cal shall be billed for SACPA clients when the following occur:

- SACPA client is Medi-Cal eligible
- SACPA client meets DMC admission criteria
- Program is Drug Medi-Cal certified

Separate Service Function Codes are established for DMC SACPA clients. The attached exhibit identifies in bold the Service Function Codes that are assigned for SACPA clients.

For submission of hard copy claims, the claims must be separated by each individual Service Function Code. A separate claim must be submitted for non-SACPA clients and a separate claim must be submitted for SACPA clients.

For submission of automated claims, multiple Service Function Codes can be submitted on a single automated claim; however, SACPA clients must still be identified separately by Service Function Code.
