SUBJECT: Countywide Averages (CWAs) for the Fourth Quarter (Q4) of State
Fiscal Year (SFY) 2020-21

PURPOSE: This Policy and Procedure Letter (PPL) notifies LGAs of the calculation
and procedures for use of SFY 2020-21 Q4 CWAs. This only applies to
LGAs that submitted an annual justification (AJ) prior to June 30, 2020
and was approved by the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS).

BACKGROUND:

The statistical information used to develop the CWA is collected from two sources: the Department of Finance's (DOF) and the California Health and Human Services' (CHHS) webpages¹. DHCS provides the CWA PPL on a quarterly basis utilizing data from DOF and CHHS. The DOF's population statistics are published annually, on a calendar year basis, and provide an estimate of the yearly population totals by county. CHHS' Medi-Cal beneficiary enrollment population totals are published on a continuous basis and provide monthly Medi-Cal beneficiary totals by county for the most recent 48 months of activity.

To calculate the CWA, CHHS' Medi-Cal beneficiary enrollment population totals are averaged for each county by quarter. Subsequently, the county's quarterly averages are divided by the DOF's estimated population totals for every county. The resultant

quarterly amounts, known as the quarterly CWA, are then converted to a percentage for each county.

POLICY:

Per the CMAA Operational Plan, to use the CWA Medi-Cal Discount Percentage (MDP) methodology, an LGA Coordinator (or authorized alternate) must electronically submit an Annual Justification (AJ) prior to the start of a claiming year to the DHCS via e-mail or the established DHCS Secure File Transfer website. The AJ must specifically state all reasons as to why a claiming unit is unable to utilize the Actual Client Count (ACC) methodology provided in the CMAA Operational Plan.

To obtain DHCS' approval to utilize the CWA MDP methodology, an LGA must have submitted an AJ to its designated CMAA analyst prior to the start of the claiming year. Once DHCS approves an LGA's request to use the CWA, the respective LGA must use the CWA MDP methodology for the entire SFY.

The accompanying document to this PPL, the "California DHCS Medi-Cal CWA for SFY 2020-21 Q4," includes the following data elements:

- The DOF estimated average population for calendar years 2020 and 2021.
- CHHS' average number of Medi-Cal enrolled beneficiaries for SFY 2020-21, Q4: April 1, 2021 through June 30, 2021.
- The number of Medi-Cal enrolled beneficiaries shown as a percentage by county for Q3 of SFY 2020-21.

Please note that only LGAs with a DHCS-approved AJ submitted before June 30, 2020 can use the CWA MDP methodology for SFY 2020-21.
