**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING IN CONJUNCTION
WITH WRITTEN PROCEEDINGS REGARDING
DHCS-12-010, Two-Plan Model Modification**

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Health Care Services will conduct a public hearing commencing at 11 a.m. on June 11, 2013, in Room 1203 at 1501 Capitol Avenue, Sacramento, California. At the public hearing any interested person or such person's duly authorized representative may present statements, arguments or contentions regarding DHCS-12-010, Two-Plan Model Modification. All other information contained in the public notice for DHCS-12-010, which was previously distributed and published in the California Regulatory Notice Register 2013, No. 17-Z of April 26, 2013 remains unchanged, including closure of the written comment period at 5 p.m. on June 11, 2013.

At the public hearing, attendees wishing to speak will be heard on a first-come, first-serve basis. Speakers may be limited to ten minutes or less, depending on the number of attendees requesting to speak. The hearing will close after all attendees present and wishing to speak have provided their testimony or at 5:00 pm, whichever comes first. Comments will not be discussed or debated by the Department, nor will speakers be cross-examined. A certified court reporter will be present to record the proceedings. Written comments may be submitted for the record at the public hearing. The Department shall consider all comments received regarding the regulations equally, whether submitted in writing or through oral testimony at the public hearing.
