1. Introduction
 - a. Dr. Paul Phinney opened meeting.
2. Review and Approval of May 27th, 2014 Advisory Panel Meeting Meetings
 - a. Minor changes to minutes.
 - b. Panel discussed the format of the meeting minutes and requested to have meeting notes with follow-up items listed.
3. Advisory Panel Membership
 - a. Dr. Paul Phinney was selected to serve as the Advisory Panel Chair.
 - i. Dr. Ellen Beck asked to have a more developed and structured process for future recruitments.
 - ii. Dr. Phinney agreed to serve as interim Advisory Panel Chair while AB 357 is being reviewed.
 - b. Sandra Reilly from Pomona Valley Medical Center was selected to represent Disproportionate Share Hospitals.
 - c. Marci Aguirre from Inland Empire Health Plan was selected to represent the Health Plans.
 - d. DHCS is soliciting recommendations for the Education representative.
4. Eligibility and Enrollment Update
 - a. Since the enactment of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) Medi-Cal has enrolled over 2 million newly eligible individuals into the program.
 - b. DHCS is working to effectuate coverage for the 490,000 individuals who have pending applications as of July 2014.
 - i. DHCS plans to reduce pending applications to 350,000 by mid-August.
 - c. DHCS implemented temporary policy for self-attestation of California residency.
 - d. As applications are being processed, the beneficiary's status may remain pending even though coverage is active and the beneficiary's information has been transferred into Medi-Cal Eligibility Data System (MEDS).
 - e. Renewal packets have been being sent to pre-ACA beneficiaries each month, beginning in April.
 - i. "Request for Tax Household Information" (RFTHI) packets include requesting tax information from beneficiaries which is now required to make a MAGI determination.
 - ii. Starting in 2015, DHCS will be utilizing information that has already been provided and verified through the federal hub to automatically renew coverage.

- iii. Counties are currently holding the RFTHI packets and are not reevaluating eligibility based on the information provided.
 - iv. DHCS is discussing renewal options with CMS.
 - v. RFTHI packets sent without a due date were sent in error. Since the error, the identified County has resent the packets with the correct due date.
 - vi. Consumers can provide tax household information through the mail, phone or in person.
 - f. Beneficiaries who were transitioned from the Low Income Health Program (LIHP) are being processed by County Eligibility Workers in the same manner as new applicants.
 - g. DHCS completed a detailed report to CMS on the mitigation plan which included data breakdowns.
5. Deep Dive Presentation: Mental Health by Karen Baylor and Brenda Grealish
 - a. DHCS is working on developing a performance outcomes system for children which will include multiple performance indicators.
 - b. DHCS continues discussions with managed care health plans and county mental health plans on mental health services integration and care coordination.
 - c. Stakeholder Comments/Questions
 - i. Stakeholders expressed concern that Federally Qualified Health Centers cannot bill Medi-Cal for mental health services on the same day as a physical health appointment; DHCS is aware of the issue.
 - ii. Stakeholders communicated that there is a need for family therapy.
 - iii. It was suggested that DHCS explore the option for school-based mental health services.
 - iv. As an outreach tool, it was suggested to include a question on the pediatric surveys at doctor's offices asking if the person is aware that mental health services are now offered under Medi-Cal.
6. Open Discussion
 - a. DHCS discussed merging Advisory Panel for Medi-Cal families with the Managed Care Advisory Group.
 - b. Medi-Cal Managed care plans cover 4.2 million children; merging the two groups would leave about 900,000 children who are receiving fee-for-service coverage under represented.
 - c. The Panel Members agreed to have separate meetings until AB 357 is finalized.
