Agenda Item: 2023 Data Notebook Survey Development

How This Agenda Item Relates to Council Mission

To review, evaluate and advocate for an accessible and effective behavioral health system.

This agenda item provides the opportunity for committee members to discuss topics for the 2023 Data Notebook.

Background/Description:

Each year the Council releases a Data Notebook to the local mental/behavioral health boards and commissions to complete with their perspectives on focused areas of the system. The Data Notebook has two parts. Part One contains standard questions that are included each year to obtain county-specific information on vulnerable populations for which there is no publicly available data. Part Two contains questions focused on different aspects of the public behavioral health system.

During the June 2022 quarterly meeting, the Performance Outcomes Committee selected the topic of “Stakeholder Engagement” for part II of the 2023 Data Notebook. The committee members will review and discuss draft questions for the 2023 Data Notebook and further develop the 2023 Data Notebook survey.

Draft Questions for 2023 Data Notebook on “Stakeholder Engagement”

1. What is the population of your County?
2. How many formal stakeholder engagement events does your county typically sponsor each year?
3. In fiscal year 2021/22, as your BH Department sponsored Community stakeholder events in preparation for updating the annual MHSA, estimate the average number of stakeholders who have attended your events?
4. Does your county do these events in person, by Zoom, or a combination of the two formats?
5. If in person, where does your county typically hold these events and what day of the week and what time of the day are the events held?
6. Who are the County Staff who typically participate with stakeholders during these events? Your answer need only be generic job titles.
7. How does staff communicate to the BH Director the input from stakeholders? What does the Director do with this information?
8. How does your county ensure that you are reaching all ethnic and demographic populations within the county?
9. Do you conduct any stakeholder meetings in threshold languages that exist within your county?
10. How does the County BH Agency communicate stakeholder input to the Advisory Board? Does the Advisory Board possess influence concerning modifications to the Annual MHSA Plan?
11. Does your county believe that these stakeholder events are successful or merely just fulfilling the statute?
12. What might improve your county's stakeholder process?
