Youth Prevention Project Conceptual Framework Overview

- Grounded in prevention research
- Considered supports that young people need to prevent substance use/abuse
- Looked at root causes of substance use/abuse
- Incorporated Advisory Group feedback



Root Causes of Substance Use

- Communities with High Concentration of Poverty
- Environmental Influences (i.e., access to liquor stores and marijuana shops, marketing)
- Historical Trauma/Toxic Stress/ACE's
- Homelessness
- Mass Incarceration
- Systems Involvement (foster care, juvenile justice)



Place-based Work

- High-poverty rural communities
- High-poverty urban neighborhoods
 - Do we want to focus on one or allow a percentage of funding to go to each?
 - Could utilize the approach GOBiz utilized.
 Identified counties that had higher than
 average arrest rates for drugs over a certain
 period of time and then also included census
 tracts with high concentrations of poverty,
 single parent households or low educational
 achievement.

General RFA Requirements

- Young people must be involved in the planning and project implementation.
 - How do we meet this requirement?
- Require that projects include both direct services and system change efforts.
 - How prescriptive do we want to be?
- Create a menu of qualified youth to be served.
