Summary of Evidence	Fresno Guest House IV is one of ten similar locations within the vicinity operated by the same provider. They rely on family to provide transportation, particularly to go without other people with whom they live. There are blanket restrictions, including, individuals are not permitted to access the community on their own; gates and doors are locked and alarmed, individuals do not have keys or a way to enter their home without staff intervention. Video cameras are used.
Summary of Remediation Strategy	Fresno Guest House IV supports individuals and their family and friends to have transportation by coordinating public transportation. Information about transportation is shared at least on admission and annually after that but also as needed. They also post information about transportation.
	At admission and at least annually after that, the staff at Fresno Guest House IV review the use of the video camera explaining how it is used so that individuals can give informed consent. Individuals are permitted to go into the community without assistance or with assistance, based on assessed needs and as documented in the person-centered plan. Individuals are given the code to disarm alarms and the key to open doors unless the person-centered team has determined that modifications or restrictions are necessary due to the individual's need.
