Summary of Evidence	Located in a building that is also a publicly or privately-operated facility that provides inpatient institutional treatment. Restrictions include call lights, visitors and individuals are asked to sign in and out, doors are locked for security reasons from 9 pm to 6 pm, necessitating visitors and individuals to call or knock to gain entry, overnight guests are limited, night clothing cannot be worn in common areas, there is a tray charge if a person wants to eat in their own room.
Summary of Remediation Strategy	The skilled nursing facility has separate admissions and administrative staff than the RCF. The only shared functions include a commercial kitchen and nursing staff in case of emergency. The setting has a variety of third-party medical providers, including registered nurses, physical therapists, dentists, dental hygienists, psychiatrists, physicians, and home healthcare workers who come onsite as needed. In addition, individuals will be given keys to the setting so they can access it independently. Individuals can wear what they want and when they want, wherever in the setting.  Individuals can overnight guests and visitors are asked to sign in and out, but it is not mandatory.
