Summary of Evidence	<p>Individuals do not have the opportunity for interactions in and with the broader community. Oak Hill Residential Care V is one of seven (7) RCFE settings located in a senior living community with an administrative office. The senior living community is surrounded by a fence with electronic gates. There are video cameras used. Individuals do not routinely receive information about services and resources available in the broader community. Oak Hill Residential Care does not schedule community activities as part of its plan for services and individuals do not have the opportunity to participate in the community with their housemates/roommates. Individuals are not supported to participate in integrated community services such as senior centers or adult day programs.</p>
Summary of Remediation Strategy	<p>Oak Hill Residential Care V says that even though they are a senior living community that is enclosed by a fence with an electronic gate, individuals will be supported to access the greater community. Oak Hill Residential Care V says that the electronic gate on the fence is unlocked, and individuals can physically go to the community. If there is an assessed need that results in a restriction to community access, the needs and restrictions are reviewed and documented in the Individual Service Plan (ISP). Assessments are completed annually. Oak Hill Residential Care will encourage individuals to set goals to reduce the need and restriction. The provider will include information about video monitoring in their admission agreement and in annual ISPs.</p> <p>Oak Hill Residential Care V intends to use a bulletin board and a newsletter to provide additional information on resources, programs, and opportunities in the community. They will collaborate with individuals and their families, so individuals have more information about services and resources in the broader community. In addition, the full-time activity director for the senior living community will plan community activities and outings. Oak Hill Residential Care will</p>



	<p>provide individuals with information about the senior center at the local Community Center that provides recreational and nutritional services for seniors, senior advisor services, and other services in the broader community.</p> <p>The staff will reference the preferences identified in the individuals' Individual Service Plans (ISP) to plan activities and solicit input from individuals to create a monthly activity calendar. Activities will include visits to the local shopping centers, museums, parks, and restaurants. These opportunities will include going out with their housemates/roommates. Oak Hill Residential Care will assist with transportation, including providing transportation, supporting individuals to reserve ride share or taxis and using public transportation.</p>
