Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) about your health insurance premiums

1) Will premium reduction affect my eligibility for health coverage?

No. You will still qualify for coverage as long as you meet all other eligibility rules.

2) If the public health emergency is still in effect, can I ask for a premium waiver?

Yes, if it's before July 1, 2022. Your premium will go to \$0.00 on July 1, 2022. Starting then, you will no longer need a premium waiver.

3) Will my Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) or Recurring Credit Card payment (RCC) end?

Yes. You do not need to do anything to end your automatic payments.

4) Will premium reduction be permanent?

Unless the law changes, your premiums will be \$0.00. We will send you a letter if the law changes and you have to pay premiums again.
